Because several of the 2010/2011 appointive officers could not continue in office it was the decision of the brethren that that for the lodge's best interest and continued success, the three principal officers should hold in place for a second year.

This has been a successful year; five brothers were Raised to the Sublime Degree. There are also brothers waiting to be passed to Fellowcraft on August 6th. A petition for Plural Membership will be spread for ballot at this July 16th meeting received from Donn Castro, a member of West Gate Lodge No. 128.

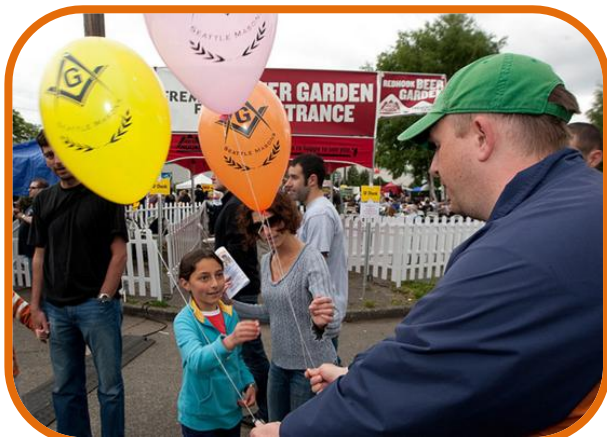

More Daylight and Seattle Theater History



W.: Brother Tommy Solberg was performing in the *Blue Mouse* house orchestra when he joined Daylight Lodge.



This became in the 1960s the *Emerald Palace* but was first called the Fox Music Hall Theater. It was remodeled into a dinner/cabaret style house. Two late Daylighters appeared on its stage, W.: Brother Allen Carter and Brother Brian Sanford.



In the 1950s and 1960s Gene Keen's Cirque Playhouse was the only Equity Union theater in Seattle. W.: Brother Allen Carter, V.:W.: Brother CoeTug Morgan and W.: Brother George Peckham worked there from time to time.



Brother Benny Priteca designed the *Longacres Racetrack* and saw it built in just 90 days in the 1930. It was located just south the I-405 and east of Southcenter where a Boeing building now sits.



This theater first called the *Seattle Center Playhouse*, built for the 1962 Century 21 World's Fair. W.: Brother Carter and V.:W.: Brother Morgan worked here during the Fair. It became home of the Seattle Repertory Theater in the early 1960s with W.: Brother Floyd Hart as the Technical Director. It later became home of the Intiman Theater

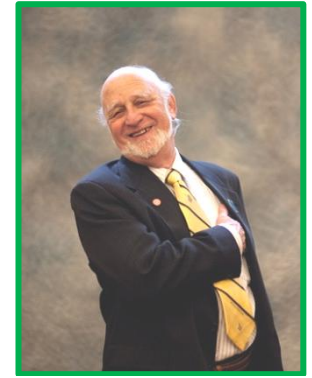
GRAND LODGE PIXS



In the 1960s for the World's Fair the *Civic Auditorium* was remodeled into the *Seattle Opera House*. The interior design was one of Benny Priteca's last works. In 2000 it remodeled again into *McCall Hall*. In its many manifestations, innumerable Daylighters worked in it. Brother Don Dawson was building manager for several years. W.: Brother Don Johnston managed it before heading up the building of the Seattle Center which he then managed for several years. Nile Temple Shrine ceremonies were held here with many Daylighters involved. W.: Brother George Peckham's voice was often heard from the stage. W.: Brother Hart did his last stage work ever in this house. For the Seattle Opera he designed the swan for Lohengrin; died the day after a performance. The Seattle Symphony with many Daylighters in the orchestra performed here for many years.

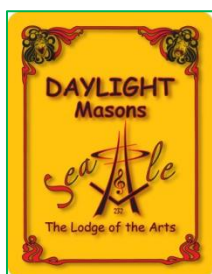

Daylight had four resolutions to revise the Masonic Code on the floor. Two of them passed, one received a majority but not 3/4th majority so it will be on the floor next year. The fourth to change the word *Bible* to *Volume of the Sacred Law* to bring Washington into harmony the majority of the Masonic World overwhelmingly failed. That was no surprise but it is one of those issues that without doubt will continue to appear until change comes.
